Playdough or Air Dry Clay Sheep

Directions:

Make an oval shape with the aluminium foil and cover it with playdough.

Make an oval shape with for the head.

Two little balls for the eyes... and the head is complete!

Using a strainer (the metal kind used to strain pasta or vegetables), press the dough from the bottom. Cut the dough and apply it to the sheep shape to imitate the fluffy wool.

Fluffy Cotton Ball Sheep

These sheep look super fun to make. You can easily substitute materials you have at home (bamboo skewers for legs instead of straws, color some paper black for the face, use different color of paper for eyes etc.) If your child is younger, you may want to print out a sheep template and avoid making a mold for the sheep.

Supplies:

- cotton balls
- news papers
- any kind of glue

- tape , black & paper tape
- black carton paper
- scissors
- wiggly eyes
- and some straw

Cheerios Sheep

These are edible sheep. I have also made sheep with one large marshmallow, 1 small marshmallow and pretzel sticks for legs.

Materials Needed:

- 2 Tbsp unsalted butter
- 2 2/3 cups mini marshmallows, plus a few additional for assembly
- 4 cups cheerios, or chocolate Cheerios, depending on desired sheep's color
- 10 - 12 chocolate covered almonds, white and dark (could substitute mini marshmallow)
- 1/2 cup chocolate chips, semi-sweet or milk
- 20 - 24 in pretzel sticks
